As I look around the room this morning, I'm struck by something that we have in common... call it a shared love!!!

## There is a love that we all share in common in this room today!

That love is... a love for the local church and God's people.

Our <u>lives</u> reveal a real love for the local church Our <u>schedules</u> reveal a real love for the local church Our <u>gray hair/ or lack of hair</u> reveals our love for God's people

# Even on the heels of a very busy fall and winter season of ministry, our hearts continue to grow in affection...

We love this thing called "the church!" We love what she can become in our town We love how God works through weakness to reveal His strength... We love how he has personally redeemed our stories!

# Along with you, I'm convinced that the church remains the primary vehicle that God uses to fulfill His purposes here on earth.

Indeed, nothing has changed since Jesus proclaimed over Caesarea Philippi community saying, <u>"I will build my ecclesia and the gates of hades shall not prevail against her!"</u>

## Any yet...

As our nation continues to grapple with issues of poverty, injustice, racial tension, political fighting and rampant sexual abuse, I believe that the voice of the church matters more than ever!!!

In these days of desperation, I see a great opportunity for the resurgence of a biblically faithful, relationally humble, evangelistically fruitful, life-transformational <u>local church</u>!

#### But a question has to be answered...

How is the church going to RESPOND in this new day? I believe that it will require more of us as leaders than ever before... Throughout history, every new work of God has required men and women to raise their game! We need to ELEVATE the standards of our faith, of sacrifice, of our expectations of ourselves, and of our belief in the goodness and the generosity of God!

# We must move beyond our desire to only *maintain* what we've accomplished and boldly step into a new thinking wavelength – <u>beyond maintenance to</u> <u>multiplication</u>.

*If we hold back, we will limit our leadership potential and occupy our days with only* <u>*ministry*</u> *survival and* <u>*minimal*</u> *growth!* 

But the battle is that we all get busy in ministry and entrenched in the maintenance of ministry. *It's always easier to maintain than to multiply!* 

What could we accomplish if we dreamed bigger...

# Isaiah 54:2-3 says... 2 "PASTORS... <u>Enlarge</u> the place of your tent, and LEADERS let the curtains of your habitations be <u>stretched</u> out; do not hold back; <u>lengthen</u> your cords and <u>strengthen</u> your stakes.

And here's why ...

3 For you will spread abroad to the right and to the left, and your offspring will possess the nations and will people the desolate cities.
4 "Fear not, for you will not be ashamed;

The very act of <u>dreaming bigger</u> will change how you think, how others around you think, and ultimately how you behave. (*Ferguson, Hero Maker*)

It all likelihood, we've all accomplished much in ministry together, but what are we dreaming about next?

There is far more that God wants to do...!!

Let's reimagine the capacity of our church today!! Now is <u>not</u> the time for small dreams or weak ambitions. Now is <u>not</u> the time for territorial jealousies or status quo ministries.

We need to be THE community leaders who think bigger and live with greater faith! >>Where maintenance in the church requires repetition >>Multiplication in the church demands greater faith

As leaders, we don't lead well or last long without great faith! I want us to talk through a basic framework to evaluate your faith quotient right now...

### Honestly evaluate your leadership using this framework...

Are you a leader focused on maintenance or multiplication?

Maintenance	Multiplication
Requires old rational	Inspires new <u>thinking</u>
Minimizes the glitches	Solves the <u>problems</u>
Modifies the style	Changes the <u>approach</u>
Limits the attrition	Releases new <u>action</u>
Assumes the challenges	Anticipates the <u>opportunities</u>
Tasks the doers	Empowers the <u>leaders</u>
Presumes the same	Imagines the <u>possibilities</u>
There is never enough	Believes there is <u>more</u>
Demands limits	Declares <u>freedom</u>
Needs control	Grants <u>permission</u>
Prioritizes the moment	Emphasizes the <u>mission</u>
Documents the past	Dreams of the <u>future</u>

Great leaders always live within a multiplication frame!! What else would you add? What is your greatest challenge?

### Leaders, you likely have a <u>baseline</u> to maintain but you need a <u>blueprint</u> to multiply!
