








Worship attendance each weekend, adults and children (median)










Small Groups as a Central Strategy in Megachurches Continues to Increase



Increased Involvement in Small Groups Makes a Huge Difference


Less of the church is involved in small groups (40% or less)






A Megachurch's Greatest Growth Occurs Between Years 5 and 20 for the Lead Pastor




Years this leader has served as senior pastor at this church


The Longer the Pastor Is at the Church, the Less Likely to Merge, Plant or Open Campuses









A Megachurch's Spiritual Vitality Peaks Between 10 and 20 Years Under the Same Senior Pastor



Megachurch Pastors Seem Better Prepared for Succession Than in 2015








Megachurch growth rate over the last 5 years




